### **FAQ responses:**

**Can anyone play in a league?**

You need to be 18 years of age or older and a member of Executive Women's Golf Association.

**I don't play that well. Can I still play in a league?**

Players at all skill levels play in the leagues. If you are just beginning, you might want to consider playing on the Red course at East Potomac Park, which is a par 3 course and an excellent format for beginners.

**Do I need to know all the rules and regulations of golf to play in a league?**

One of the advantages of league play is the opportunity to play golf, experience different situations and learn how the rules and regulations apply.

**My schedule won't allow me to commit to playing every week of the session. What should I do?**

If you can only play once in awhile, consider signing up as a substitute. You can select the courses where you want to sub and your name gets placed on the sub list for those courses. When someone needs a sub, she will contact you by e-mail and, if you happen to be available, you can play in her place.

If, however, you think you may only have to miss one or two weeks of a session, consider joining as a full participant and then

you may use the sub list to recruit someone for those rounds when you are not available.

**I don't have a handicap. Must I have one to join a league?**

You do not need to have a handicap to join a league. In fact, if you play in a league, it will help you establish a handicap if you choose to do so.
